Plan	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Reviewing the process of developing and implementing health and safety policies, including setting objectives, establishing procedures, and allocating resources.
Do	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Discussing the importance of risk profiling and conducting health and safety assessment to identify hazards, assess risks and prioritise control measures.
Check	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Considering methods for measuring health and safety performance, including accident and incident rates, near-miss reporting and compliance audits.
Act	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Emphasising the value of learning from incidents, near misses, and audit findings, and taking proactive steps to implement corrective and preventive actions to enhance health and safety performance.
